Describe how you usually go shopping for groceries in your community. How does this compare to shopping in Cambodia?

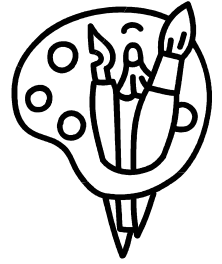


Think about transport, and buildings, what you buy and how you pay for it. What things are different and what are the same?
